LJUBLJANA

DAY 1

- Arrival Ljubljana International Airport
- Ljubljana is the capital and the biggest city of Slovenia
- Panoramic city tour in Ljubljana
- During the city tour; **Medieval Castle, City Hall, Cathedral of St. Nicholas, Triple Bridge** will be visited.
- **Medieval Castle**, is a castle complex standing on Castle Hill, above downtown Ljubljana. It is a key landmark of the town. Recommended to go up to the tower, to see wonderful view of all city.
- **Ljubljana Town Hall**, it the town hall in Ljubljana, the capital of Slovenia is the seat of the City Municipality of Ljubljana. It is located at Town Square in the city center close to Ljubljana Cathedral.
- **Cathedral of St. Nicholas**, Ljubljana Cathedral officially named St. Nichola Church, or simply Cathedral. Originally was a Gothic church, in the early 18th century, it was replaced by a Baroque building, the cathedral is near to Ljubljana Central Market and Town Hall.
- **Triple Bridge**, is a group of three bridges across the Ljubljana River. It connects the Ljubljana`s historical medieval, town on one bank, and the modern city of Ljubljana, on the other.
- After city tour lunch will be in local restaurant
- After lunch, free time for shopping
- Transfer to hotel for resting
- Dinner will be in local restaurant
- Accommodation will be in the hotel.

It is the second-longest cave system in the country (following the Migovec System) as well as one of its top tourism sites. The caves were created by the Pivka River. • Lunch will be in local restaurant • After lunch, drive to Zagreb the capital city of Croatia (Croatia is the youngest member of the European Union and Croatia is one of the most developed country in the Balkans). • Upon arrival to Zagreb have a panoramic city tour and visiting the Dolac Bazaar, St. Mark Church, Stone Gate, Pope's Tower, Ban Josip Jelacic Square, Lotrseak Church, and Mirogoj Park Cemetery. • Dolac Market/Bazar, is a farmer`s market located in Gornji Grad-Medvešček city district of Zagreb. Dolac is the most visited and the best-known farmer`s market in Zagreb, well known for its combination of traditional open market with stalls and a sheltered market below. • St. Mark Church, is the Paris church of old Zagreb, located in St. Mark's square. It is Roman Catholic Church, in late gothic style and with some Romanesque style. Radically reconstructed in the second half of the 14th century. • Stone Gate, medieval stone gate into town with a Virgin Mary shrine popular for prayer I candle lighting. • Pope`s Tower, was built in the middle of the 13th century in order to protect the southern city gate. Climb it for a sweeping 360-degree view of the city. Near the tower is a funicular railway, constructed in 1888, which connects the Lower and Upper Towns. • Ban Josip Jelacic Square, central square with a tram stop, café & iconic, equestrian statue, that is a popular meeting stop. It is a historical monument in Croatia, and the biggest square there. • Cathedral, is situated in Kaptol is a Roman Catholic institution and not only the tallest building in Croatia, but also the most monumental sacral building in Gothic style southeast of the Alps. It is dedicated to the Assumption of Mary and to Kings Saint Stephan and Saint Ladislaus. • Free time for shopping • Dinner will be in local restaurant • Transfer to hotel and accommodation.

	<p>Europe and the largest national park in Croatia: In 1979, Plitvice Lakes National Park was added to the UNESCO World Heritage register. The national park was founded in 1949 and is situated in the mountainous karst area of central Croatia, at the border to Bosnia and Herzegovina. <p>DAY 5</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">PLITVICE – TROGIR - SPLIT</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Breakfast and later check-out in the hotel • Departure for Trogir <p>Trogir is a historic town and harbour on the Adriatic coast in Split-Dalmatia County, Croatia, with a population of 10,818 and a total municipality population of 13,260. The historic city of Trogir is situated on a small island between the Croatian mainland and the island of Čiovo. It lies 27 kilometers (17 miles) west of the city of Split.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Arrival to Trogir and get a walk in that city which has town under UNESCO World Heritage-listed. Next to coast of Adriatic Sea will be our walking area. • Lunch will be in Trogir in local restaurant • Departure for Split • Arrival Split and panoramic city tour in Split • During the city tour; Diocletian’s Palace on the UNESCO’s List of World Cultural Heritage with Peristyle, Jupiter’s Temple and the Cathedral, Outview St Duje Cathedral, The Bell tower will be visited. <p>Diocletian`s Palace, is an ancient palace built for the Roman Emperor Diocletian at the turn of the fourth century AD, that today forms about half the old town of Split. The interesting and fanny thing is that you can be inside of palace and not know it. A part of the old town Split is actually located inside the palace. The Palace is on the UNESCO`s List of World Cultural Heritage.</p> <p>Temple of Jupiter, is a temple in Split, dedicated to the Jupiter, Ancient Roman God of sky and thunder and king of the Gods.</p> <p>Cathedral of Saint Domnius; known locally as the Sveti Dujam or colloquially Sveti Duje, is the catholic cathedral in Split. The cathedral is the seat of the Archdiocese of Split-Makarska, headed by Archbishop Marin Barišić. Built in 305 century this cathedral dedicated to the city patron saint has a Romanesque Bell Tower.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • After city tour, free time in old town in Split • Dinner and accommodation will be in our hotel.
<p>DAY 6</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">SPLIT - DUBROVNIK</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Breakfast and later check-out in the hotel • Departure for Dubrovnik • Upon arrival to Dubrovnik, panoramically city tour in Dubrovnik • During the city tour; Stradun Square, Orlando sculpture, The Palace of Rector, The oldest pharmacy of the Europe, Time Tower, War Museum, and Francis Monastery will be visited. • Stradun Square, or Placa is the main street of Dubrovnik, Croatia. The limestone-paved pedestrian street runs some 300 meters through the Old Town, the historic part of the city surrounded by the Walls of Dubrovnik. • Orlando sculpture, the column, erected in 1418, features armored Knight Orlando who according to the legend, helped the people of old Dubrovnik (Ragusa) defeat invaders in the middle ages and therefore helped Dubrovnik to remain a free trade city-state. • Rector`s Palace, is a palace in the city of Dubrovnik that used to serve as the seat of the Rector of the Republic of Ragusa between the 14th century and 1808. It was also the seat of the Minor Council and the state administration. • Oldest pharmacy of the Europe, originally opened in 1317, the old pharmacy has been in operation for over 700 years. Interested visitors can take a walk through the



	<p>monastery during the summer time only.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Time Tower, is based on two bronze figures, the bell strikers, popular, zelenci, (green twins) are locally called Maro and Baro. The best time to be at Stradun and enjoy the pleasant and well-known tune of Tower`s shimming antique bells is very day at the Noon. • War Museum, the museum of Croatian War for Independence is located on the ground floor of the Imperial fort on Srđ Mountain. The museum has four themes: the fall of the Dubrovnik Republic and history of the Fort Imperial, the Serbian-Montenegrins aggression in 1991, days of victory-the liberation actions of the Croatian Army, suffering of the people, civilian buildings and cultural monuments. • Lunch will be in local restaurant • Free time for shopping • Afterwards, transfer to our hotel, dinner and accommodation
<p>DAY 7</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">DUBROVNIK - MOSTAR</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Breakfast and later check-out in the hotel • Departure for Mostar • Upon arrival to Mostar, panoramically city tour • During the city tour; Catholic Cathedral, Old Town, Koski Mehmet Pasa Mosque, Karagozbey Mosque, Mostar Bridge, Ottoman Hammams, Homes and War Museum will be visited.... • The Old Bridge Introduction: originally in Bosnian, Stari Most, is symbol of the city, and BIH. Built in 16th century by the order of Sultan Suleyman the Magnificent. With its arched shape, 29 meters total length, the bridge is encribed in to the UNESCO`s list. • Old Bazar Kujundžiluk an Ottoman- era market that maintains its original atmosphere thanks to cobblestone roads, narrow streets lined with artisan shops, and Turkish ornamentation. Colorful houses made of heavy stone and wood are charming part of the city. • Koski Mehmed Paša Mosque, is 16th century mosque located on the bank of the river Neretva and 150 meters distanced from the Old Bridge area. • Crooked Bridge (Kriva Ćuprija) is another ancient bridge which`s date of construction and the constructor are unknown. By going through destruction during the war in 1993 and reconstructed in the year 2001. • Herzegovina Museum, the building constructed during te Austrian-Hungarian period is an example of m mixture of architectural between the Austrian-style dwelling and Oriental Residency. • War Photo Exhibition, this collection of around 50 powerful wartime photos is displayed in the western tower guarding Stari Most, above the Bridge Diver`s Clubhouse. • Lunch will be in Mostar Old Town • Visit Blagaj Tekija • Short information about Blagaj Tekija; • The Tekija was built on solid rocky soil at the right side of the source of the Buna River, one of the biggest in Europe. A very high cliff stretches above the Tekija for some 240 meters. On top of that cliff lie the remains of Stjepan Vukcic-Kosaca`s fort-town dating back to the Middle Ages. The complex was damaged more than once because of rocks collapsing. The European nettle trees that grow from the cracks of the cliff above the Tekija significantly contribute to the frequency of the collapses. It is a well-known fact that the Tekija was rebuilt after each of these unfortunate events, on multiple occasions such as: during the first half of the 17th Century, in 1716, 1871, 1923, 1949, 1951, 1972 and 2011. • Dinner and accommodation will be in the hotel

Church, Fire of Freedom, Sebil, Old Bazaar...

Gazi Husrev -bey Mosque is a 16th century structure located in the main pedestrian Sarači street with a beautiful courtyard and it is the largest historical mosque in Bosnia and Herzegovina and of the most representative Ottoman structures in the Balkans.

Baščaršija Square in the epicentral of Sarajevo built by the order of Mehmed Pasha Kukavica in 1753. It was relocated by Austrian architect Alexander Wittek in 1891.

Sarajevo City Hall, known as Vijećnica is the structure facing the local river Neretva and on the outside of the Baščaršija Square. It was designed in 1891 in the pseudo Maurish style by the Czech architect Karel Parik.

By finishing The City Hall proceed to the **Franz Ferdinand Museum** and assassination spot, and hear the story of the event and the Museum from its external part: FF Museum is one of the most sophisticated museums in Sarajevo in terms of its installation technology and the story behind the museum. The museum exhibits the assassination of the Archduke Franz Ferdinand and his wife Sofia by the Gavrilo Princip.

Cathedral of Sacred Jesus heart: This is a largest catholic cathedral located in Austrian architecture part of the city. It is the largest cathedral in Bosnia and Herzegovina. This holy structure is functional for the prayer services for the local believers and tourists as well. The building was damaged during the Siege of Sarajevo after which went under the reconstruction.

Upon this walking by **Eternal Flame** a memorial to the military and civilian victims of all Yugoslavian nationalities and religions who were fighting against the fascism during the Second World War in Sarajevo. The memorial was dedicated to the date 6th April 1946.
