We set off on the Tonle Sap River, which famously reverses direction each year We cruise past the Royal Palace compound and around the Chrouy Changvar Peninsular on to the mighty Mekong River. Today it is a museum of torture and serves to remind visitors of the terrible atrocities that came to pass in Cambodia. ✓ We then travel out of town to the Killing Fields of Choeng Ek. ✓ Visit Mosque at Boeung Kok Phnom Penh for pray. ✓ Lunch at local halal restaurant ✓ Then visit to independent monument, King Morodom Statue & Chaktomuk Riverside. ✓ travel to the Russian Market, one of the premier shopping destinations in the Cambodian capital.

After some time here to browse or buy, we travel to the impressive Central Market, one of the city landmarks. Originally completed by the French in 1937, this striking structure is

known as Psar Thmei in Khmer or New Market. then make for Wat Phnom, a symbol of the city. ✓ Dinner at local halal restaurant Overnight in Phnom Penh PHNOM PENH - SIEM REAP - CITY TOUR (B/L/D) Breakfast at local restaurant/hotel This morning, we will transfer you to bus station for travelling to Siem Reap, upon arrival Siem Reap, you will transfer to hotel for check in. Lunch at local halal restaurant ✓ Next, in the center, hundreds of people streamed in and out of a small alcove where stately brass and bronze statues of **Preah Ang Chek and Ang Chom stood**. These sister deities, believed to have been Angkorean princesses, originally stood in the gallery of One DAY 3 Thousand Buddhas at Angkor Wat, however successive generations of monks moved them repeatedly to keep their whereabouts secret from invaders and treasure hunters, until they were finally enshrined in their current location in 1990. ✓ Then we enjoy do shopping around old market. ✓ This afternoon, we will go to visit the **Silk Farm in Puk District** (18 Km from town) where can see the whole process of making silk from the center. ✓ Dinner at local halal restaurant ✓ Join the Night Pub Street + Shopping at night Market Overnight in Siem Reap SIEM REAP - ANGKOR WAT - ANGKOR THOM - TA PROHM (B/L/D) Breakfast at local restaurant/hotel We rise early to travel to **Ta Prohm** in the dawn light. Ta Prohm has been abandoned to the elements, a reminder that while empires rise and fall, the riotous power of nature marches on, oblivious to the dramas of human history. And Angkor Wat Believed to be the world's largest religious building, this temple is the perfect fusion of symbolism and symmetry and a source of pride and strength to all Khmers. Built in the 12th century by King Suryavarman II, this is most famous temple at Angkor ✓ Lunch at local halal restaurant ✓ In the afternoon, we visit the immense walled city **Angkor Thom** that was the masterpiece of King Jayavarman VII. Following the occupation of Angkor by the Chams from 1177 to 1181, the new king decided to build an impregnable fortress at the heart of his empire. We DAY 4 begin our visit at the Terrace of the Leper King. This intricately carved platform was the royal crematorium and the statue that was originally thought to be the leper king is now believed to be Yama, the god of death. We continue along the Terrace of Elephants, originally used as a viewing gallery for the king to preside over parades, performances and traditional sports. At the southern end lies the Baphuon, once of the most beautiful temples at Angkor, dating from the reign of Uditayavarman in the 11th century. Our climax is the enigmatic and enchanting temple of the **Bayon**. ✓ View Sunset from Bakheng Mountain! ✓ Dinner at local halal restaurant ✓ Overnight in Siem Reap SIEM REAP - BOAT TRIP TONLE SAP - DEPARTURE (B/L) Breakfast at local restaurant/hotel ✓ In the morning, you will visit at Floating Village (Tonle Sap). The Tonle Sap Lake, fed by the mighty Menkong and the Tonle Sap River, is a vast expanse of water that forms the DAY 5 most significant topographical feature in Cambodia. ✓ Lunch at local halal restaurant ✓ Next transfer you to the Siem Reap International airport depicturing your next destination.
